Dig In

Because God is God of gods, I can be certain of...

Humanity’s evident limitations (v. 1-11)

- We read that Nebuchadnezzar’s dream caused him great anxiety. Why is uncertainty able to produce such fear in us?
- Nebuchadnezzar faced limits even as the leader of a superpower nation. He had no one to give him an answer to his deepest fear of being overthrown and many potential reasons to worry. How did God use this limitation to bring about humility in Nebuchadnezzar’s life?
- How do you see God bringing about more humility in your life?

God’s immeasurable power (v.12-23)

- Daniel confessed his limits and sought help from God through intense prayer. If your humility was measured only by time spent in prayer what would this reveal about your sense of dependency on God?
- A limitation often becomes a new motivation to pray. How are you currently praying about an area where God has limited your ability? What do you want him to do and why?

God’s supernatural revelation (v. 24-30)

- How do you currently demonstrate attentiveness to God’s word? Is this resulting in any blessing, growth or radical transformation?
- What will you do as a next step to give more attention to what God has said?

God’s absolute sovereignty (v. 31-49)

- The interpretation of Nebuchadnezzar’s dream shows us that even the greatest political powers in the world operate within God’s predetermined plans. In light of this revelation, what new ways can you bring your life more in line with God’s sovereignty and show you worship him?

Break Out: Use this time to discuss matters of resistance to worship. Try to determine what a full response to God’s sovereignty could look like in each of your lives.
