The study of the book of Job and its concluding chapter lead to four conclusions as discussed in Pastor Edward's sermon. Have your conversations, forgive and seek to be forgiven, start afresh, and let God turn the pages of your life.

GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Before digging into the questions share some point from the sermon or an observation in the passage that stood out to you. How do you think you're meant to grow as you try to apply this to your life?

Are you familiar with Job's story in the Bible? What are the losses he experienced? According to the opening chapters of Job, why did all this to happen to him?

What feelings do you think Job and his wife had while waiting for God to relieve his suffering? What was the key question Job had for God during this time?

Can you relate to Job's suffering? Have you been through an experience that caused similar emotions and questioning? As you're comfortable, share some of this experience with your group members. *(If you've been sharing already, give others in your group this opportunity to open up.)*

What are some truths about God that you know do not change regardless of the difficulty and hardships He allows you face? How do you strengthen those convictions about God so you can stand on them when trouble comes to your life?

Who is likely to be present with you through your pain, grief, and depression? What non-verbal ministry can they have with you in those trials? How can a small group be there for each other during a loss, without making things worse by trying to provide an answer to the suffering?

Why might you assume that someone is at fault for the suffering they're facing? How does God's rebuke of Job's friends help you think twice about trashing a friend's character simply because their life has taken a terrible turn?

If you've openly and wrongly accused a suffering friend of sinful behaviour what should you do to bring about reconciliation? Why does God care about reconciliation between believers?

How could your willingness to pray for friend who has openly insulted your character unlock your heart and open the door wide to restored relationships? If there is a friend who has done this to you, what prayer could you offer on their behalf this week?
