1 PETER 3:8-12 // DWAYNE FRANCOIS MAY 9, 2021

If you are tired of the struggle with people and want to see good days be in love with God's people (1 Peter 3:8), stop retaliating over offences (1 Peter 3:9a,10-12; 1 Peter 2:21-23), and bless the world because of your calling (1 Peter 3:9b, 1 Peter 3:9a,10-12; 1 Peter 2:21-23).

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1.	Consider the idea of your next good day? Where will you go? Who will come with you? What will you talk about?
2.	What are some new struggles that have presented themselves for you throughout the pandemic? What has your response to these struggles revealed about you?
3.	Why do you think Peter has encouraged the church to aim at Uncommon Community during their struggles? Which of the five traits of 1 Peter 3:8 have you more recently experienced? What is the effect on you when one of these traits has been missing?
4.	Where have you seen examples of anger over injustice resulting in sinful retaliation? How can the wrong response attempt to "ruin people God wants to redeem"?

	Did the questions from the previous message at Harvest (<i>Don't Waste the Pandemic</i>) lead you to any conclusions that relate to this message? Have you identified any situations that require you to keep your tongue from evil and your lips from deceit? In those types of situations, what are you doing that is more consistent with the encouragement of 1 Peter 3:10-12?
6.	Besides blessing, what are other appropriate responses to evil and reviling that remain consistent with God's judgement and character? Can you think of places in Scripture the demonstrate these examples?
7.	As we move forward, some of our struggles will remain. What will it mean for you to seek peace and pursue it? Is there a specific situation or relationship where this immediately applies?
